IASSIDD is in official relations with the World Health Organization (WHO). We currently have an agreed work plan that covers six areas.

- Supporting the development of the <u>mental health Gap Action Programme (mhGAP)</u>, especially in the area of intellectual disability. mhGAP aims to scale up services for mental, neurological and substance use disorders in low and middle income countries.
- Contributing to WHO work on estimation of <u>Burden of Diseases</u> in the area of intellectual disability.
- Supporting the production, dissemination and use of the <u>World Report on Disability and</u> Rehabilitation.
  - Contributing to the revision of <a href="ICD-10">ICD-10</a> categories related to intellectual disability.
- Providing support for national and global efforts to promote health and rehabilitation for persons with disabilities.
- Providing relevant material to WHO in the area of intellectual disability and to disseminate WHO material to researchers in intellectual disability.
