Introduction

This is an example of 50 Point type. Don't use anything smaller than 40 point type. It might not look as if you have much space to put in a lot of detail. However, the art of a good poster is that you summarise the key issues and leave people wanting more.... You want them to come to you, to talk with you at the conference and ask lots of questions. From this short paragraph you can get the idea that you have about 120 to 150 words maximum to summarise the background to your project – short, sweet and to the point: really just an abstract; just establish why your topic is of importance!

Key References

Just two or three in APA style – a journal article, book reference or website the reader might find helpful if they want to know more

Aims / Research Questions

This should be a brief statement of your hypothesis or topic of inquiry; what you set out to find out about; the key questions.

Method

Participants

Who was involved – how many people; from where; any particular distinguishing characteristics?

Materials

What tools or instruments or questionnaires did you use; or did you construct them yourself?

Procedures

Key activities or phases of your project
(maybe in dot-points)

Analysis

Qualitative or quantitative or mixed methods;
and what type of analysis?

Key Findings / Future Directions

What did you find out and how does this relate to your hypothesis or topic of inquiry?

Do you want to insert a table, figure or picture to illustrate your findings?

How might others use what you found?

What questions might future researchers need to follow-up?
